As we head into Summer 2024, get ready for our upcoming facility improvements and upgrades!

#### Splash pad opens May 18!

On Saturday, May 18 at 12:00 pm, the Seely Park splash pad will open! Hours of operation will be daily from 12:00 pm to 7:00 pm. 3000 Pope Avenue.

#### New hardcourt volleyball courts

Volleyball hardcourts will be installed at Howe Park, 2201 Cottage Way. These courts are made possible through a grant from the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency.

#### New shade structure

A shade structure will also be installed at Howe Park in the permittable picnic area near the north parking lot. The shade structure was made possible by the SMUD 2024 Shine grant.

#### New gazebo

A new gazebo will be built in Santa Anita Park, 2271 Bell Street, near the Bell Street entrance. The gazebo is funded through a grant from Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency.

#### **New playground**

A new playground will be built in Bohemian Park, 3131 Wright Street and Yellowstone.

Bohemian Park Project design will begin. The District received \$10.445 million for the project; \$4 million from former Assembly member Ken Cooley and \$6.445 million from the California State Parks Prop 68.

So, look out for these additions while visiting your neighborhood parks. And join in summer programs through Little League, summer camps, swim and synchronized swimming teams, and swim lessons. Or enjoy a family and friends event at one of our community centers or picnic facilities. Read on to find your ideal summer activity.






